

Prof. Dr. Jürgen Coppik is an independent consultant since 2010 with his company *Coppik Economics*, based in the region Düsseldorf, Köln, Bonn. As both, a Professor in Economics and a doctor in Law, he specialises on economic subjects in the intersection between Law and Economics, such as economic analyses in competition law and expertise on damage claims.



Jürgen Coppik has extensive experience in professional consulting and as an industry executive. He has been providing economic advice on antitrust and regulatory litigation for more than 20 years. His primary focus is the preparation of economic analysis and expertise designed for lead attorneys' litigation purposes in court or administrative proceedings.

Prof. Coppik's broad litigation experience incorporates numerous successful engagements in defense against cartel damage claims and in cartel/abuse cases, including proceedings in front of German High Court (Bundesgerichtshof), such as *liquid gas (Flüssiggas)*, the Federal Constitutional Court (Bundesverfassungsgericht) and against the European Commission, for example *International Roaming*.

Before striking out on his own, Jürgen Coppik worked for four years at the international management consulting firm A.T. Kearney (2000-2004), where he focused on strategy and (de-)regulation in the telecommunications and media sector, followed by five years with Vodafone, where he was responsible for competition economics and regulatory strategy (2004-2009).

Jürgen Coppik holds a master degree in Economics as well as in Law. His dual scientific background and practical experience in both, Economics and the Law, enables him to explain economic content to a judicial audience in a unique and very comprehensible way. He is also deeply skilled in consulting, having worked with strategic management consultancy A.T. Kearney as a senior consultant and project leader.

In 2007, Jürgen Coppik earned a doctoral degree in Law at Freie Universität Berlin and in 2018 he was promoted to an honorary Professor of Economics at the Düsseldorf Institute for Competition Economics (DICE), where he has been a lecturer since 2013. He publishes regularly in academic and competition-law journals.
